
Membership Renewal

Upcoming Outings—Weekend Hikes

Saturday, April 23, 2022 Mullens Cove Loop

Location: Prentice-Cooper State Forest

Driving Time: 20 min from foot of Signal Mountain

Distance: 10 miles

Rating: Moderately Strenuous Elevation Gain: 1700 ft Pace: Standard, 2mph

Trail Conditions: Rocky for .5 mile

The Mullens Cove Loop is a great spring hike. And we will still have views of the river! This trail rolls with some ups and downs, but no long or steep climbs. There will be several streams to cross, but they should be easy to rock hop, unless we have a lot of rain beforehand. While there will be a few wildflowers, this area is best known for Snooper's Rock and its terrific view of the TN River gorge. While the Mullins Cove Loop starts from the Cumberland Trail parking area, it is not officially part of the CT, however, we will intersect the CT where it makes its way over to Signal Point in a 13.7 mile hike, which we can do another day! Hikers do need to have had recent previous experience with at least 7-8 miles of hiking and some hills. Since the hike is local and there is good parking available, we will meet at the trailhead for which I will give directions upon registration. To register, contact Susan Faidley

Sunday, April 24, 2022 Sitton's Gulch Trail

Location: Cloudland Canyon, Trenton GA trailhead. **Distance:** 5 miles. Daniel Creek to Hemlock Falls.

Rating: moderate

(Options of longer strenuous or less distances on your

own)

Pace: Standard

Wildflowers should be plentiful for this hike. For carpooling, meet at Cummings Highway Walmart parking lot @ 8:30. Hike start time 9:30 at trailhead. Wear hiking boots/sturdy shoes. \$5 for parking. Gas \$ for driver if carpooling.

Sunday, May 1

Location: Moonshine Trails on Lookout Mountain

Distance: 10 miles **Elevation gain**: 950'

Rating: moderately strenuous **Pace**: standard 2.0-2.5 mph

We'll meet at Covenant College and hop on the Chattanooga Connector Trail for 2 miles to the junction of White Lightening, taking us to Gerber Branch. Loop around on Firewater and Bathtub Gin before returning. Sections of this trail system are flush with mountain laurels, which hopefully will be beginning to bloom. Saturday, May 7, 2022 Virgin Falls, Sparta TN

Location: Virgin Falls State Natural Area

Driving Time: 1 hour 45 minutes from Chattanooga **Meeting Time at Trail Head:** 9 am ET (8 am CT) –

Virgin Falls in Central Time Zone

Distance: 9+ miles including 8.4 mile lollipop loop

and a couple short side trails

Rating: Strenuous

Elevation: 1000+ ft. (up on the way out)

Pace: Standard/Fast

Trail Conditions: Rocky, uneven at times, cable

crossing

Explore the beautiful and mystical Virgin Falls on this strenuous 9+ mile journey. There are three other falls: Big Branch, Big Laurel and Sheep Cave. Virgin Falls seems to originate and disappear with no visible water source though we'll hike up and around to peek into its subterranean source: a cool (literally and figuratively) cave on top. This is one of the best rated hikes in Tennessee but make a note that it is strenuous so please be prepared. At this time, I don't have backup for both a fast and slow group so we will keep a pretty fast pace on this. With lunch at bottom, I'm estimating at least 6-7 hours. I will pre-hike a few days before to see if trail is accessible so you must RSVP for updates. Hike leader: Shelly Lewis RSVP at

Sunday May 15 Summit Knobs

hiking/equestrian unit for Enterprise South Nature Park

Distance: 6.0 miles

Elevation gain: about 500 feet

This is an out and back hike on a quiet rolling trail, mostly through the woods, with one easy stream crossing. Half. mile open and sunny stretch within the first 2 miles, near the solar farm. Weekend March 25-26, 2022 Devil's Fork State Park, South Carolina Oconee Bells Weekend

Saturday, March 25 -This morning, approximately 25 Chattanooga Hiking Club members, met at Devils Fork State Park SC at the Oconee Bells trail for a short hike. The Oconee Bell is



a rare flower of the southern Appalachians with a very limited range in the wild. Unfortunately due to high winds, our boat ride was cancelled for the following day. Ken thankfully had another plan. We met then at Bad Creek Hydro parking lot to explore the Whitewater Falls. After a short hike, we reached Upper Whitewater Falls. According to the U.S. Forest Service, "With a 411-foot plunge, Upper Whitewater Falls in North Carolina is the highest waterfall east of the Rockies." We then continued on the interesting and challenging trail to our lunch location.



A smaller group continued to the lower Whitewater Falls (completely different waterfall) platform. A quite impressive waterfall too. We hiked approximately 7 Miles in 4 hours. 
