Gregory Bald via Wolf Ridge Trail

Location: GSMNP

Driving Time: about 2 1/2 hours from Ooltewah, TN

Distance: 16 miles roundtrip **Rating:** Very Strenuous **Elevation Gain:** 4000 ft **Pace:** Slow to Standard

Hike to the top of Gregory Bald just in time to see the beautiful Flame Azaleas in full bloom! This is a challenging hike that will take 8-9 hours total time so be prepared! The views and blooms at the top make it well worth it, however. Plan is to meet at Ooltewah Food City by 7AM for the carpool, to arrive at the trailhead at 9:30AM and start hiking. Because of the long day you may choose to meet with others the night before in nearby towns such as Murphy, NC which is about 1 hour 15 minutes from the trailhead. Save the Date September 17-18, 2022 Yellow Daisies at Stone Mountain and Arabia Mountain



Every year in September, an explosion of yellow flowers covers granite outcrops (also known as monadnocks) in Stone Mountain, Arabia Mountain, and Panola Mountain just

outside of metro Atlanta. These are yellow daisies and they are one of the fall wonders in several of Georgia's finest parks. They are found in only four states: Georgia, Alabama, North Carolina and South Carolina.

Barbara McCollum is organizing an overnight trip to Stone Mountain and Arabia Mountain. We'll drive to Stone Mountain on Saturday morning and have the option of hiking the Cherokee Loop Trail or riding the tram to the summit. 
