Saturday, April 8, 2023

Collins Gulf - Stagecoach Road Loop Hike

Location: Gruetli-Laager near Savage Gulf State Park

Driving Time: 1 hour from Chattanooga

Distance: 12 miles Rating: Strenuous Elevation Gain: 1760 ft.

Pace: Standard

Trail Conditions: Some rocky trail and stream crossings

This challenging hike has always been my favorite on the Cumberland Plateau! It has a little bit of everything....waterfalls including Suter Falls and Horsepound Falls, spring flowers, beautiful rock formations, the Collins River with house size boulders, swinging bridges and nice overlooks! The area down to Horsepound Falls is well known for its flowers, so we will take our time through there to enjoy them. Hikers need to have experience with stream crossings and through small boulder fields with possibly wet rocks. And, if we have had much rain, we might not be able to cross the Collins River requiring us to backtrack. If this hike appeals to you, and this description fits your experience level then please join us!

*Water shoes are required.

Appalachian Trail: Woody Gap to Neels Gap

Location: Suches, Georgia

Driving Time: 2.5 hours from Chattanooga, + shuttle

Distance: 11 miles Rating: Strenuous Elevation Gain: 2500 ft.

Pace: Standard

Trail Conditions: Some rocky trail

This is our third section hiking the famed Appalachian Trail! We will start where we left off at Woody Gap on our second hike. We will have to put a car shuttle in place ourselves or by paying a little to hire an AT shuttle driver, so none of us have to drive back to retrieve cars at the beginning of the hike. This section of trail is somewhat rocky on Blood Mountain, but not too difficult. However, there is enough elevation gain to make it quite strenuous, as we do climb Blood Mountain. But the pay-off views are well worth the climb. The hike will have a limit of 12 to 16 people depending on the shuttle. This outing is for experienced hikers who are members of the CHC. Sunday, March 19, 2023 Sitton Gulch and Cloudland West Rim



On a chilly but sunny morning a group of hikers met at the Sitton's Gulch Trailhead, ready to tackle an early spring walk and climb to the West Rim of Cloudland Canyon. Another objective was to admire the many wildflowers blooming all along the trail. Daniels Creek was

flowing and Hemlock and Cherokee Falls were gushing in full force. Tackling the steep stair climb to the top of the gorge, the hikers caught their breath and then enjoyed the views from the gorge and the plateau along the West Rim Trail. After the exhilarating walk everyone proceeded back down along the scenic creek to the parking area. Several hikers made a short but colorful detour along the wildflower loop. There were multiple wildflowers all along the stream valley with trillium, foamflower, and trout lilies especially abundant. Thanks to Rita Pendergast for leading and Steve Barnes reporting.






Reports from the Field

Wednesday, March 15, 2023 North Chickamauga Creek

Che and Susan met with a group of regulars and several new hikers at the trailhead. After a frosty beginning they ascended the old mining road above beautiful North Chickamauga Creek and before reaching the old coal mining tipple remains and the entrance to an old "doghole" mine. There were a couple of slips and falls but no major casualties as we split into two groups. Che led one group to return via the rugged Hogskin Loop while Susan and Dan proceeded on along the bluff towards the stairway to Boston Branch Overlook and the link to the Cumberland Trail. There were clear vistas to the east towards Soddy as well as the southern view over Boston Branch. This area of the North Chickamauga Creek Gorge State Natural Area is one of four proposed new State Parks in Tennessee. Hikers enjoyed the impressive overhanging bluffs and the distant views of the gorge. After lunch at the base of a waterfall near the Stevenson Branch campsite they returned to the parking area. The hike was rugged but pleasant and the cool spring weather made for a refreshing Wednesday walk. Thanks to Che, Susan, and Dan for leading.

Helpful Hints for Weekend Hike Leaders

Hikes can be scheduled for any Saturday or Sunday. If there is a long hike scheduled, and you want to lead a short hike, two hikes can be scheduled for the same day. Please contact Susan (susanf.chchiker@gmail.com) if you would like to lead a hike even if you do not have all the details. Try to get descriptions to Susan by the 15th of each month for the following month.

Before each hike, keep track of hiker contact info in case a hike needs to be canceled or changed. A good tip is to use the Consent Form to keep track of sign-ups.

Rule #1: DON'T LOSE ANY HIKERS!

- Wait a few minutes after designated leave time for any later comers.
- Always designate a sweep.
- Either the group or a designee should wait at all trail intersections until the last hiker is accounted for.
