Members on the Move

Unforgettable New Zealand

Five members of the Chattanooga Hiking Club flew to New Zealand for a 23-day trip on both the north and south islands. After two days in Queenstown to get over jetlag, we flew to Auckland to begin the 'Sweet North' portion trip with New Zealand Trails. On the north island, we hiked on a sheep



farm, kayaked at Cook's Beach in the Pacific Ocean, visited thermal pools in Rotorua, watched glow worms at Waitomo Caves, and trekked on the spectacular Tongariro Crossing in Tongariro National Park. Lauded as the best day hike in New Zealand, the views are outstanding with a lunar-like land-scape and sites from the Lord of the Rings movies.



Our 13-day 'Kiwi Classic' trip began on the south island in Queenstown. Here, we hiked at Mt. Cook and swam with dolphins on the northeast coast, one of the highlights of the trip.

Our first overnight hike was to Nydia Lodge in a picturesque rainforest on Marlborough Sound. Accommodations were similar to Len Foote Hike Inn, with flush toilets and showers. The second overnight hike was in Nelson Lakes National Park, in the northern part of the island, to Bushline Hut with a group of 14. Our guides carried most of our food, but each

hiker carried a portion of their dinner and breakfast. Our cycling activity carried us from Arrowtown (a very touristy, picturesque town) to Queenstown where we crossed the stunning Kawarau River, home of what some claim is the world's first and most popular Bungy Jumping site. Although we enjoyed watching the thrill seekers, our group stayed grounded.

Our last two hikes were on the southwest coast in Fiordland National Park and included portions of the popular Routeburn and Kepler Tracks. The trip ended with a cruise on Milford Sound, the 8th Wonder of the World, known for its cascading waterfalls and jawdropping views.



New Zealand is known for producing first-class merino wool, delicious lamb for the dinner table, and the world-famous Fergburger in Queenstown. The country proudly embraces its indigenous people, the Maori, and many New Zealanders are taught the Maori language in elementary school. Also, no matter how small, it seemed like every town or village had clean public toilets.

Spectacular glaciers, rugged mountains, vast plains, subtropical forests, miles of coastline with gorgeous sandy beaches - its all in New Zealand. Club members Ray and Maricruz Sherman, Noel and Terri Holcomb, and Barbara McCollum (reporting) will savor the memories of this trip for years to come.



Finding Your Way

Ever wondered how to convert coordinates from Google Maps or Google Earth to your GPS? <u>This video</u> offers an explanation of the process. The <u>PGC</u> <u>Coordinate Converter</u> from the University of Minnesota has a tool that allows you to convert your coordinates.
